Sermon Notes: Prayer Is Oxygen Speaker: Pastor Wes

I. Introduction

- Emphasis on the critical importance of prayer in the life of a believer.
- Reference to Acts 16:25 as a foundational scripture for the sermon.
 - Acts 16:25: "But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them."

- Encourages the congregation to actively engage in prayer, not as a passive act but as a proactive approach to life's challenges.
- Highlights the need for believers to embrace their authority in Christ to effect change both in the spiritual and physical realms.

VI. Scriptural Mandate for Believers

- Reference to Mark 16:15-18, discussing the signs that will follow those who believe:
 - Mark 16:15-18: "And He said to them, 'Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues; they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.'"
- Emphasis on the importance of acting on the Great Commission and the power that accompanies faith.
